


Know all men by these presents that I

just and full sum of Four thousand
dollars to the payment of which well
and truly to be made I bind myself,
my Heirs Executors and Administrators
jointly and severally firmly by these
presents sealed with my seal and
dated this 18th day of January 1836.

The condition of the above obligation
is such that whereas I have this day
Emancipated and set free my following
Negro Slaves named Lewis, Robert,
Curus, Ruben, Fanny, Molly, Nancy
Matilda, Ephraim, William Augustus,
Henry, Charlotte & Eliza Jane.

Now if the said Arthur Thome or his Heirs
Executors or Administrators shall well and truly keep
said Negroes from becoming a County charge to
the County Court of Bracken County and well
and truly maintain said negroes in case they
or any of them should become unable from age or
otherwise to support themselves, then this obligation
to be void else to remain in full force.




